Develop disciplinary literacy

- Investigate links between words and their composite parts
- Use activities to engage students with developing use of key terminology
- Carefully select the vocabulary to teach and focus on

Use effective feedback

- Use feedback to investigate knowledge and understanding
- Provide feedback regularly and on specific pieces of work
- Provide feedback as comments and provide meaningful opportunities to respond to feedback

Develop enterprising individuals

- Encourage and provide opportunities to develop as enterprising individuals with the ability to think commercially and creatively
- Provide opportunities to investigate and analyse real business opportunities

Develop quantitative and qualitative skills

- Provide opportunities to develop and apply quantitative skills relevant to business, including using and interpreting data
- Provide opportunities to make justified decisions using both quantitative and qualitative data

Develop problem-solving skills

- Encourage students to find solutions to problems using own research and skills
- Encourage students to make informed decisions with decision-making skills relevant to business
- Encourage resilience when developing solutions

Develop authentic experiences

- Provide opportunities for students to engage in real-life experiences
- Use projects, tasks and activities that include open-ended inquiry, development of thinking skills, and metacognition
