Students are involved with other community groups, including: Braunstone Heritage, Braunstone Wombles, The Curve, Rugby Works, Duke of Edinburgh, Forest School and Aspire Clubs.

The creation of an anti-hate crime video in collaboration with the Stephen Lawrence Centre and Blaby Council, which was launched at TWS and shared with other schools.

House ambassadors have been launched this academic year, providing opportunities for student leadership and their voices to be heard.

Aims for this year include

Holding a student leadership conference

Set up a community fridge onsite at TWS

Continue the success of working with the Stephen Lawrence Centre following a change in Leadership.

Continue to connect with local community groups to create further student opportunities.

It was highlighted that the student ambassador schemes at TWS have been replicated at other Life MAT schools.
